

"... a self-publication, motivated by a desire for self-expression, not for profit."

- Often represent minority opinions
- Document otherwise undocumented events, movements, scenes, subcultures...
- Even with the rise of modern technologies, fanzines tend to be intentionally produced with less sophisticated methods & materials than "prozines"
- Many professional artists were first published in zines

In the meantime, it seems the only way to start a new article is by creating a link to a new article title on an existing page (like your own user discussion page) and then following that link and editing it.

Welcome to the QZAP Zine Archive

The Queer Zine Archive Project (QZAP) was first launched in November 2003 in an effort to preserve queer zines and make them available to other queers, researchers, historians, punks, and anyone else who has an interest DIY publishing and underground queer communities.

To get started with the zine archive try browsing through the collections or searching for specific terms. Our main collection is organized as alphabetical by title ("Zines E-H" for example.) We generate metadata (information about the zine) from the zines themselves, try searching on a keyword (e.g. *queercore*), a year (e.g. *1996*) or place (e.g. *Toronto*.).
